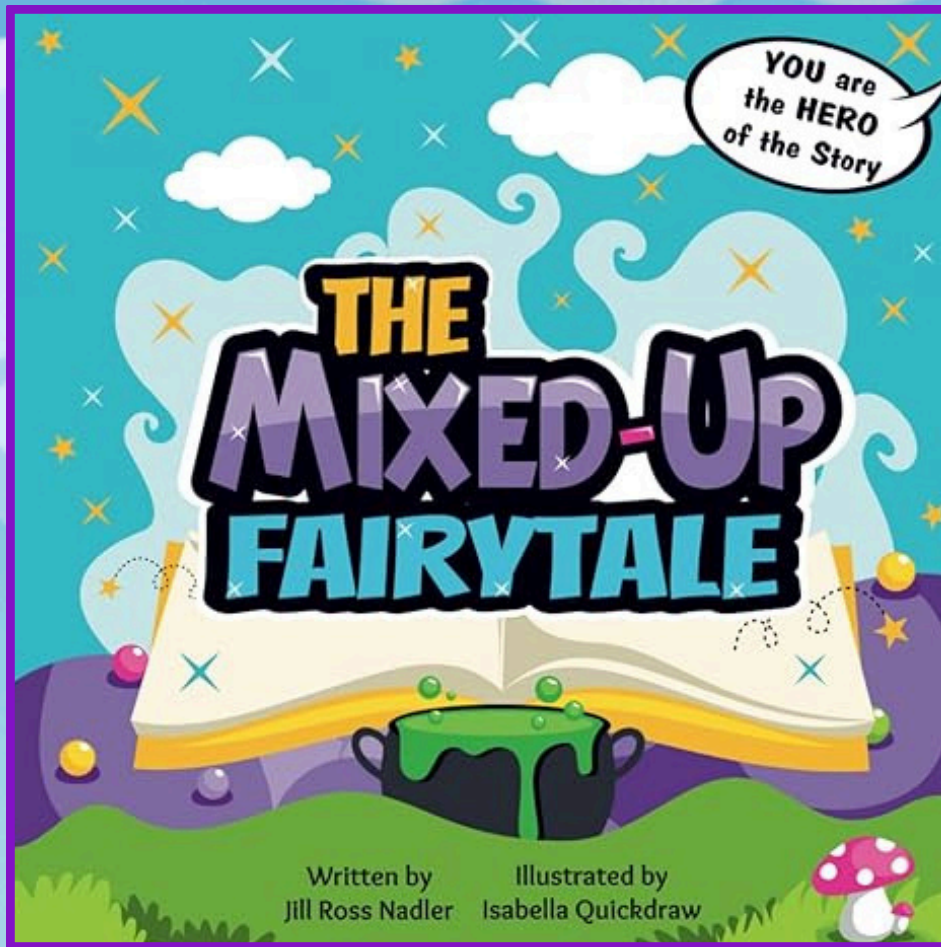

Did you know that every story has three parts?

Beginning
Middle
End

But what should go in each part?





Well...

1. BEGINNING

At the beginning of the story we start with a main character who wants something and feels a certain way.

2. MIDDLE

Something gets in the way of the character getting what they want.

3. END

The character changes or learns something at the end of the story. They also feel differently from how they did at the beginning.

Think about a fairytale that you know and then...

- Change the problem that has to be worked out
- Change where the story takes place
- Have the story take place in another time
- Tell the story from a different character's point of view
- Combine elements from several stories into one new story (like Mixed Up Fairytale).

A few more things to think about ...

**All stories have a beginning, a middle, and an end.
Fairytale have a few other things in common. They...**

- Often take place in the past
- Usually have a character who is good and another who is not
- Often have magic things happen
- The plot involves a problem that needs to be solved
- Have happy endings when the problem is solved
